


Dear Parent and Carers.

It has been an exciting start to 2020 with a very busy January and February. We are enjoying an incredibly busy term which will provide pupils with an abundance of rich learning experiences.

#### Outdoor Update

As you may know, this year we are planning on developing our outdoor spaces for play and learning. We have consulted every child and have collated their views. Some of their ideas include: more areas to sit together to talk, reading areas, more tyres for playing, specific areas for sports, opportunities for den building and obstacle courses. Over the next few months, you will notice new fencing in part of our playground, new benches, a wooden tee-pee, wellies and waterproofs for our pupils, a mud kitchen and outdoor storage units. We will continue to work with our Outdoor Learning Committee to ensure our pupils' voices are at the centre of our plans.

#### Celtic Connections



## **Physical Education**




