

# Gartconner Early Learning and Childcare

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome all our new and existing families to Gartconner nursery. Over the course of each term we will be updating your children's learning experiences and play throughout the use of learning journals and parent consultations. We hope this will help all our parents and carers with the involvement of their child's development within the centre. All children's health and wellbeing is paramount. In the event of a child protection issue/concern Mr Manley is the main point of contact for all families/children within the centre. We will be introducing tooth brushing again after a long stop due to Covid therefore, please keep your eyes peeled for future updates on this. We will be trialling weekly surveys for lunch orders for children coming in for their 1.15 sessions. If you kindly fill this out and return it as soon as possible to ensure your child has their input of their lunch selection. We will continue operating in zones in the meantime, however, moving forward with the easing of Covid restrictions we will update all parents on this after the September break. This is to ensure the change is gradual being mindful of everyone's safety within the centre.

# What we are learning about/ focusing on?

### Butterfly room/Blossom room zone 1&3

The staff are focusing of the children's transitions from home to nursery. The other main focus is the transition of children from the 2-3 room into the 3-5 room. The children have been doing great coming into the nursery during these unforeseen circumstances. We hope all parents can rest assured that their child/children are settling in great at nursery. The planning will be focused on the children's health and wellbeing tailored to their interests. This responsive planning targets learning experiences based on the children's interests. The children have been discussing "All about me" looking at various ways of building friendships with others. The staff have been concentrating on routines and personal hygiene promoting independence and responsibility. We are now developing the garden area through discussion with children. The children have requested a castle to be built. Therefore, the staff are finding ways to resource this for the children. We are now baking everyday ensuring children are involved in their snack making and eating fresh bread. The children are enjoying mixing, filling and weighing the ingredients. This will encourage early numeracy and fine motor skills. We strongly promote the rights of the child within the nursery therefore, children's voice is evident when planning and making choices. Although zone 1 is the 3-5 room and zone 3 is the 2s room the focus on settling remains the same. Moving forward the planning for both rooms will slightly change as the 2s room will plan using the pre-birth and the 3-5 room will plan using the curriculum for excellence. The planning as a whole will be responsive tailored to children's interests.









### Blossom room zone 2

The children are responsively accessing areas of their choice to ensure they are selecting resources they are interested in. staff are focusing on settling new children into the nursery. Staff are planning responsively to children's needs and interests. This will allow staff to plan ahead any future adult led experiences. The staff are focusing on All about me. Staff are promoting hand-eye coordination and fine motor skills by drawing what we look like, families who live with us and any pets we have. The staff have been focusing on plp targets and parental comments supporting the children with their all-round independent skills. The staff are encouraging personal hygiene and new routines reinforcing this daily. The children have requested some instruments therefore, staff will be bringing in pots, pans and spoons creating a musical wall. The children will be encouraged to bake each day developing their numeracy and fine motor skills.

Please note; Can all parents and carers regularly check their child's learning journal for updates on experiences and play within the nursery. All new starts will be added to the learning journals once the enrolment process is completed
