We are mindful that Seesaw has added greatly to teacher workload and although valuable for children, parents and staff, all users need to keep in mind that time spent on Seesaw takes away from the teachers' planning, preparation and correction time. Please keep it to a minimum and within working hours, approximately 8am-5.30pm. Remember that messages regarding appointments and pick-ups, buses and the like must come via the school office rather than via the teachers. ## 14. Earrings

As per EDC guidance, no child can do PE with earrings in. School staff can't help children remove earrings so children must be able to remove them independently or not have them in that day. I am often asked about this and I can't have any adaptations to the guidance as this is from EDC rather than the school. The ideal time to get ears pierced is the last week of summer term.

Any earrings worn to school at any time must be stud earrings.
