	<ul> <li>Extending their knowledge of number to solve a range of mental addition and subtraction within 1000, justifying how their strategy choice is efficient.</li> <li>Using both mental strategies and written algorithms to solve a variety of addition and subtraction tasks.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Your child will also be working on multiplication and division strategies by learning to: <ul> <li>Use counting strategies to multiply single digits by single digits, up to 10x10.</li> <li>Multiply a multiple of ten by a single digit, e.g. 6x60.</li> <li>Calculate multiples of 10 by multiples of 100, e.g. 40 x 300.</li> <li>Multiply a 2-digit number by a single digit using the grid/split methods e.g. 56 x 6 = (50 x 6) + (6 x 6) = 300 + 36 = 336.</li> <li>Mentally multiply a 2-digit number by 2, 3, 4 or 5.</li> <li>Divide a 2-digit number by a single digit (including remainder).</li> <li>Develop written strategies for multiplication and division.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	Pupils will be building on previous measurement skills in term 2, in particular:  • Using their knowledge of the sizes of familiar objects or places to assist them with making an estimate of measure.
	<ul> <li>Using the common units of measure such as metres, centimetres, millimetres, kilograms, grams, millilitres and litres.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Converting between related units of the metric system and carrying out calculations when solving problems.</li> </ul>
	Explaining how different methods can be used to find the perimeter and area of a simple 2D shape or volume of a simple 3D object.
	Pupils will also begin to investigate more complex number sequences by explaining a rule used to generate a sequence and applying it to extend the pattern. Pupils will apply their knowledge of number facts to solve problems where an unknown value is represented by a symbol or letter.

### Recognition Board and Postcards Home

We are continuing to develop our Recognition Board in class. The purpose of the board is to foster positive interdependence in the classroom. It is a collaborative strategy which will target learning attitudes and behaviour. The target chosen will raise the expectation for all the children. The board will emphasise peer responsibility where pupils are rewarded for effort.

We are now introducing Positive Notes home. The positive note is sincere recognition for those pupils who go over and above consistently. We want to communicate good news to you at home.

Hot Chocolate Friday with Mrs Rodden— This will be a reward for those children who behave impeccably. Their name will go into the special box and each week six lucky names will be taken from the box and invited to share a Hot Chocolate with Mrs Rodden.
